Programme Elucidation:

The Centre for Advanced Agricultural Science and Technology (CAAST) is a new initiative and student centric sub-component of "National Agricultural Higher Education Project (NAHEP)" implemented by Indian Council of Agricultural Research and funded by Government of India as well as World Bank. The Navsari Agricultural University, Navsari, Gujarat bagged a CAAST project entitled "Establishment of Secondary Agriculture Unit for Skill Development in Students and Farmers" on competitive basis during 2017-18. One of the main objectives of the project is capacity building among PG Students as well as farmers of South Gujarat region in different activities of Secondary Agriculture. Under this project a one day on-campus Skill Development Training on "Collection, Storage and Marketing of Mahua resources" (મફુડા ની ઉપયોગીતા અંગેની તાલીમ) for tribal community actively involved in Mahua collection was organized by Unit-2 (Scientific Utilization of NTFPs & MAPs) under NAHEP-CAAST sub-project at ASPEE College of Horticulture and Forestry, NAU, Navsari.

Rationale of the training:

Secondary agriculture is regarded as a sunshine sector of India which encompasses agriculture, forestry, horticulture and animal husbandry. It involves "assembling, ripening, cleaning, grading, sorting, drying, preserving, packing and storing of agricultural produce. It can play a major role in achieving the GoI's goal to double the farmer's income. NTFPs are associated with the socio-economic and cultural life of forest dwellers. To ensure their livelihood and nutritional security, work on sustainable utilization, processing, value addition and marketing of NTFP resources is very essential. Skill development and capacity building in this regard would strengthen the tribal community involved in the utilization of NTFPs. Among NTFPs, *Mahua* is one such crop that needs a supply chain which extends from the collection of resources in the forest till the sale of *Mahua* based processed, semi processed and value added products in the market. In this training programme, we invited *Mahua* collectors from South Gujarat region and

connected them with GSFDC, Gujarat. We also invited resource persons to share their experiences and knowledge regarding *Mahua* crop in the one day training programme on "Collection, Storage and Marketing of *Mahua* resources".

Objectives:

• To create awareness among tribal collectors about *Mahua* conservation and sustainable utilization including the marketing strategies

Introduction:

The training programme started with the registration of participants and an informal inauguration wherein the trainees introduced themselves. All participants were from tribal community and actively involved in *Mahua* collection process. Two prestigious organizations namely Gujarat State Forest Development Corporation (GSFDC), Vadodara and Bharatiya Agro Industries Foundation (BAIF) assisted the organization of this event. Resource persons from GSFDC delivered effective lectures in the training programme about various aspects of *Mahua* resource conservation, utilization and management. The BAIF office at Kaparada taluka in Valsad District coordinated with NAU and participants to successfully involve the tribal gatherers of *Mahua* in the event.

About the Training:

The training comprised of various lectures, interactions, demonstrations, group discussion, etc. Due to the prevailing Covid pandemic, the number of participants was restricted to 28 tribal collectors of *Mahua*. Status of participants by Gender and Social Inclusion is given in **Annexure 1**.

Technical Session:

Core Session 1: The introductory lecture was delivered by Dr. H. T. Hegde, Assistant Professor & Associate Faculty (Unit-2), NAU, Navsari. He briefed participants about the purpose of the training programme and introduction to the NAHEP- CAAST sub-project, its mandates and achievements. He gave an overview of the *Mahua* resources and natural populations available in South Gujarat. With the help of research outputs he gave a clear picture of the declining status of natural populations of *Mahua*. Interactions were held about the need of conservation and improving the productivity.

Core Session 2: was conducted by Shri. D. R. Gohil, (Retd.) Deputy Manager, Gujarat State Forest Development Corporation Ltd., (GSFDC), Chhotaudepur. He described the sustainable collection of *Mahua* and its proper storage techniques. He explained the scientific way of collecting *Mahua*. He also spoke about the activities necessary after collection and proper manner of storage to ensure long term usage.

Core Session 3 (Practical demonstration): was taken up by Dr. S. K. Sinha, Asst. Prof., and & Co-PI (Unit-2), NAU, Navsari, on oil extraction process. He spoke about the importance and widespread uses of almost every part of *Mahua*. In addition, he also explained the working of small scale oil extraction unit and reduction in wastage. He mainly emphasized the different aspects of biodiesel production from *Mahua* seed oil which has recently gaining considerable importance.

Core Session 4 (Hands-on-Training): The third lecture was given by Mr. B. Rathod, Former Deputy Manager, GSFDC, Gujarat regarding the importance of *Mahua* conservation and protection from fire damage. He explained the importance of natural regeneration in *Mahua*. He elaborated about the negative impact of fire damage to natural population of *Mahua* during collection. He interacted with the participants and conveyed a strong message about the need for conservation.

Core Session 5: In a very interesting and interactive manner, Shri M. R. Patel Sr. Manager, GSFDC, Vadodara explored the marketing opportunities for *Mahua* products and Govt. supported schemes. Lecture helped trainees understand the alternative marketing options for *Mahua* resources. He highlighted the Minimum Supported Price (MSP) available for *Mahua* and Govt. schemes which support *Mahua* collection and marketing.

Salient upshots of the training:

Tribal collectors of South Gujarat region were sensitized about the following aspects

- ➤ Conservation of *Mahua* resources for future generation
- ➤ Importance of sustainable and hygienic collection of flowers and seeds
- ➤ Negative impacts of fire damage to the natural population of *Mahua*
- ➤ Proper storage methods to ensure long term storage
- ➤ Better utilization aspects and marketing opportunities for *Mahua* products
- ➤ Govt. supported schemes for *Mahua* collectors

Valedictory programme:

The valedictory function was held on March 18, 2021 from 17.15 pm onwards in the Swami Vivekananda Hall, ACHF, NAU, Navsari. The Hon'ble Vice- Chancellor of Navsari Agricultural University, Dr. Z. P. Patel presided over the valedictory function. Dignitaries of this function were - Dr. S. R. Chaudhary, DR & Dean PG Studies; Dr. P. K. Shrivastava, Principal and Dean, ACHF; Dr. T. R. 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

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
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
